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PREVIEW OF THE UNIVERSITY

The Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University, Ajmer was established on 1st August, 1987. The University has since then steadily grown and successfully completed 37 years. The contribution in the academic field has been remarkable. There has been an astonishing growth in the University infrastructure which includes magnificent buildings, Hi-Tech Science Laboratories, a state-of-the-art Computer Centre, a prestigious library, an Administrative and Examination Block, separate Science, Social Science, Environmental Science, Management Blocks and a highly impressive Vice-Chancellor's secretariat. There are promising job oriented courses and intensive research oriented programmes. There are also Self Financing Courses in several teaching Departments. The University was accredited as B++ by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore in 2017. The University Library is unique and the first in the state being fully automated since 2003, having technical and financial support of the UGC's INFLIBNET Centre, Ahmedabad.

The C-Net Centre, EDU-SAT, Campus wide networking using OFC 6 Core are all a reflection of the emphasis of the University to the fact that gaining knowledge can no longer be restricted to the four walls of any institution. There is always scope to explore research and discover while sailing through the process of gaining education. The Teaching Departments and Centres of at the University Campus include Botany, Commerce, Computer Science, Economics, Education, Environmental Science, Food Science and Nutrition, Geography, Hindi, History, Kaptan Durga Prasad Choudhary Department for Journalism, Mass Communication & Multi-Media Technique, Law, Management Studies, Mathematics, Microbiology, Pharmacy, Political Science, Population Studies, Pure and Applied Chemistry, Remote Sensing and Geo-informatics, Yogic Science and Human Consciousness and Zoology. There is an Entrepreneurship Centre (Center for Entrepreneurship and Small Business Management -Center for ESBM) and Research Centres – Algae Biofuel and Biomolecules Centre, Ambedkar Shodh Peeth, Maharshi Dayanand Shodh Peeth, Samrat Prithviraj Chauhan Eitihasik Evam Sanskritik Shodh Kendra and Sindhu Shodh Peeth. There are 464 Colleges affiliated to this University which are spread over 4 districts (Ajmer, Bhilwara, Nagaur and Tonk) of the State of Rajasthan. The University registered 3,45,201 students for various courses during the 2024-25 session.

ERP CENTRE and ACP

1. ERP-MIS Software:

The ERP-MIS Software was purchased from IIPL NOIDA vide order no. MDSU/GAD/ERP/2007/2688 dated 26.03.2007. Under this purchase order 4 modules Viz. Financial Accounting for Account section, Payroll & HR for Establishment section & A&f section, Store & Inventory for GAD Section and Affiliation module for Academic-II section. In the month April'2011 the firm was again called by MDSU with the intent to restart the work by the COF and firm started the customization in A&F module. Also an extensive Training was given to the A&F staff. Now already Procured SERVER was installed on July'2011 in the ERP Centre. As a result following works at A&F section are now being done by the A&F staff on ERP system:

- Work relating to cash & document receipts.
- Work relating to Payments and cheque preparation.
- Work relating to processing of medical Bills and tuition fee bills.
- Work relating to Examiner's remuneration Bills.
- Work relating to all types of advance Adjustment.
- Work relating to Payment of TA Bills.
- Preparation of various Registers of A&F works.
- Handling Bills of overtime of university Staff.
- Coordination in work relating to repair/maintenance/connectivity of nodes.
- Server Management related works.

2. Work relating to State Public Procurement Portal:

As per directions of State Government tenders issued by GAD section for procuring goods and services under transparency Act 2012 are being uploaded on SPPP portal from 10/07/2014. All tenders of value above 1 lacs and less than 5 lacs provided by GAD section are uploaded on the Portal.

3. Work relating to E-Procurement Portal:

In compliance to the procurement of goods and services transparency Act 2012 the University has started procurement through e-procurement Portal. To accomplish this activity following works were done:

- Digital signature of university officers are used in publishing, opening and uploading the documents on e-procurement portal.
- In this year tenders where cost of procurement was above 8 lacs were floated through this process. The threshold limit has now been reduced to 8 lacs for procurement of goods and services and Rs 05 Lacs for procurement of works.

4. Campus wide Networking under NMEICT project:

The ministry of Human resource and development (MHRD) is administering the centrally sponsored plan scheme namely National mission on education through Information and Communication Technology (NMEICT). Under this scheme, one of the components is to be providing connectivity to universities and colleges. BSNL-MTNL has been assigned the responsibility for the same.

Under the NMEICT, MDS University has been provided the 1 GBPS high speed Internet connectivity line on 27-01-2011. To make utilization of 1GBPS line throughout the university the setup of LAN-infrastructure is completed through the BSNL empanelled vendor.

- Vide order NO F2()/GAD/MDSU/2014/20226-35 dated 13/9/2014 Prof. Neeraj Bhargava, Head Deptt. of Computer Science has been made In-charge to look after further necessary progress of NMEICT project.
- ACP is looking after LAN networking work and related issues of Chanakya Bhavan.

5. Work relating to Web Administrator:

Vide order NO F2()/Estt./MDSU/2016/21880-930 dated 22/08/2016 the work of web Administrator (from Prof. Neeraj Bhargava, Head Deptt. of Computer Science) has been assigned to ACP to be executed through ERP cell. The university website mdsuajmer.ac.in is being maintained in coordination with M/s Avid web solutions, Udaipur in compliance to the above. Now the work of Web Administrator vide order no f()/estt./mdsu/2020/20347-392 dated 29-9-20 has been assigned to Prof. Neeraj Bhargava, Head Deptt. of Computer Science.

6. Work relating to Rajasthan Sampark Portal and CM helpLine:

Following activities relating to Rajasthan Sampark portal is being coordinated through ERP centre:

- Creation of Sampark users and their administration acting as Nodal officer.
- Training to users to dispose raised grievances. So far 3 sessions of training are organized.
- Received grievances are moderated and allocated by the Registrar office and departmental heads (trained users) dispose/ reply the grievance on the portal. The ERP centre provides hand holding support in this process.
- 95% grievances received by the university have been disposed.

7. Work relating to Rajasthan On-line Scholarship Portal:

This portal attempts to integrate activities of the student, college and university in the context of granting scholarship to the students. On the portal University has roles as approving authority. While various university department acts as Institute and Nodal agency to forward the received scholarship applications online of their students. The ACP is assisting in IT works to Deputy Registrar Academic-II and Deputy Registrar SC-ST cell as well as department heads.

8. Work relating to vidhanSabha, Lokshasabha Question Cell:

Traditionally in the University this work is carried out through GAD section. The Staff posted in GAD like Steno GR-II, ASO, LDC, IV Class actively work for secretarial work in preparing the reply of various vidhan sabha questions (VSQ). The undersigned undertook the work relating VSqs in compliance to the OO f2()/GAD/MDSUA/2019/6994-7050 dated 24-06-2019 onwards. As on today no VsQ is pending for reply.

9. Work relating to GeM Portal:

GAD section is a purchase unit in this University. The purchase through GeM portal is done as per procedure laid down for operations on the portal. In the University DR/AR GAD is designated as Buyer/consignee and PAO/DDO from A&F section makes the payment for purchases done through GeM. As per OO F2()/GAD/MDSUA/2018/8225-770 dated 7-5-18 I am working as the nodal Officer.

The Guest House of the M.D.S. University is known as Shradhanand Shikshak Atithi Grah. It is situated on the Pushkar Bye Pass Road, near Jaipur - Ajmer National Highway No.8. It was formally inaugurated by the then Governor of the state Shri Bali Ram Bhagat on 13th Oct 1996. This is a modern, double-storeyed building located in the foothills of the Aravali mountain range. A well organised Guest House is the pride of any institution. The Guest House provides accommodation to Academicians and other persons visiting the University for official purposes. The University Grants Commission has given assistance in the construction of this Guest House. Jodhpur stone has been used in this building with a traditional Rajasthani look similar to the buildings which have been constructed in the main University Campus. It has 2- AC VVIP Suites and 16 AC double bed rooms and a large Dining Hall. Also on the second floor there is a 5 bedded dormitory. It has an inner court yard with a green lawn where guests may enjoy the winter sun-shine or relax during the warm summer evenings. The Guest house provides accommodation on twin sharing basis. The office of the Manager, is located on the ground floor.

Round the year there are guests in University campus on official assignments. The visitors are provided accommodation in the well- maintained and fully- furnished university guest house. The staff here works on the principle of ATITHI DEVO BHAVAH.

RULES FOR STAY IN THE GUEST HOUSE

1. For Block Booking (more than three rooms) i.e. for conference/short term courses etc. 50% payment to be made at least two weeks in advance and permission of Hon'ble VC/Registrar is required.
2. Charges for one day shall be levied if rooms are not occupied/remains unutilized after booking.
3. Normally a booking in the Guest House can be made for a period of 3 Days which can be extended up to a maximum period of 7 and beyond that period with the approval of the competent authority.
4. The management of the Guest House may at its discretion, cancel a booking or offer another type of accommodation e.g. a bed or twin sharing basis instead of a full room, depending on availability of accommodation.
5. Guests are advised not to leave valuables in the room while they are away. The Guest house is not responsible for loss, theft or damage of articles belonging to the guests.
6. Check out timings 24 hrs.
7. It is mandatory that for booking a room, a timely submission of the duly filled reservation form of the Guest House which has been signed by the guest/the person booking the room be done on time and this reservation form be sent in advance to the concerning authorities in the Guest House.

CENTRAL LIBRARY

The Central Library is functioning since 1988, housed in a separate three storied library building named ‘**Saraswat Bhavan**’ in an area of 5100 sq.mtr. approx., out of which reading area is 1500 sq.mtr. 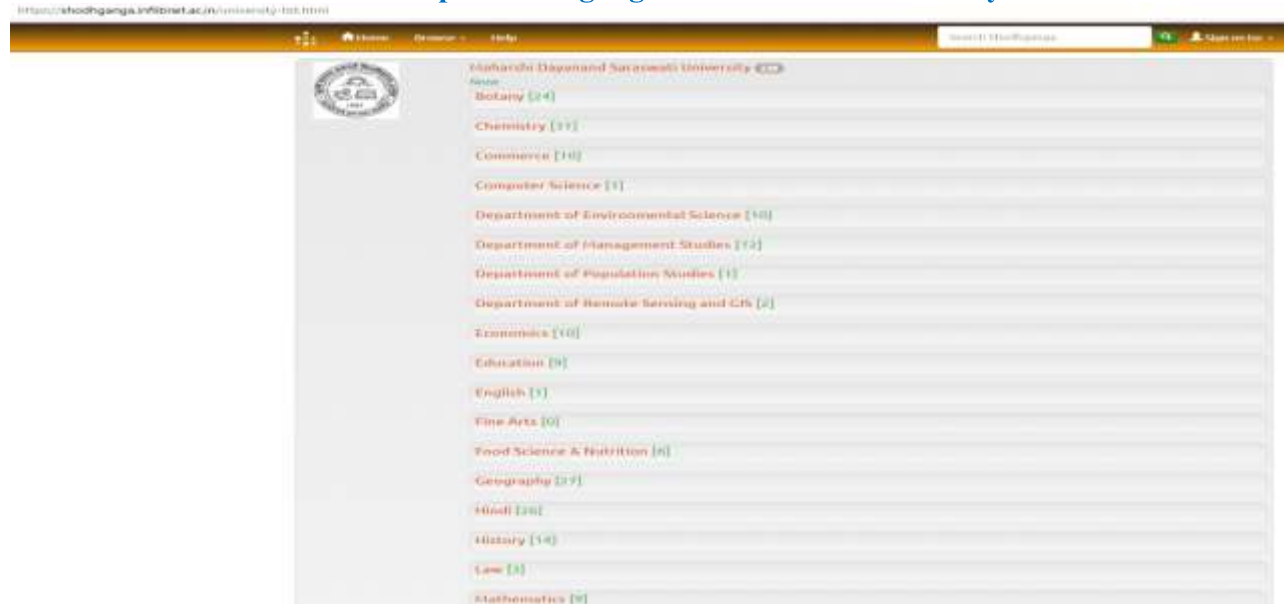

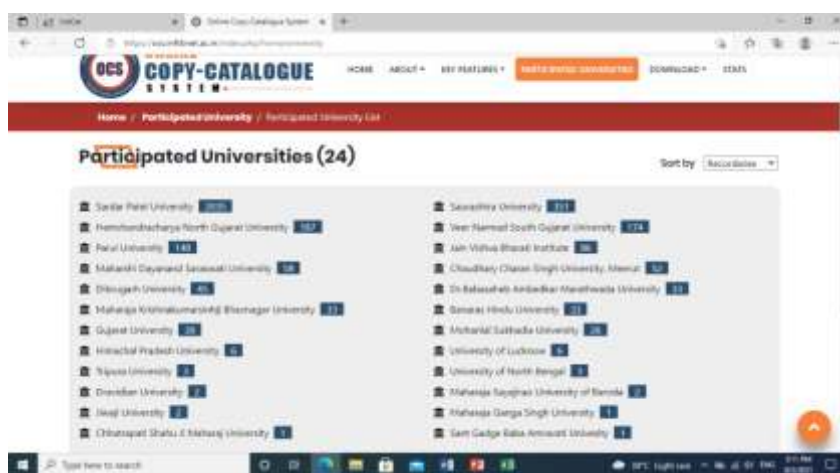

DEPARTMENT OF MICROBIOLOGY

Small components are the most vital and potent parts of any system and so are microorganisms for the planet earth. The Department of Microbiology (DoM) aims to quench the curiosity about life of organisms that are invisible to the naked eye. Knowledge about this microcosmos shall impart deeper understanding of the life as a whole. It answers how life is sustained (evolution), whether there is life on other planets (exobiology), how do the microorganisms live (cell biology, physiology and genetics), how many different types of microorganisms are there (biodiversity), what is their role, how do they interact with other beings and what are the extremes of their life (biogeochemical cycles-ecology) and whether man can utilize them for his benefit and for the continued existence of life on earth comprising fields of biotechnology, industrial, agricultural, environmental, medical, food, water and air microbiology. With a motto “**unveil the hidden strength**”, the faculty tries unveiling the hidden strength of the students and that of the invisible friends. The M.Sc. Microbiology program was started by the University in 1993 that was the first such course in the State of Rajasthan.

Distinctions

The DoM was **recognised** as *Satellite Centre for Microalgal Biodiversity in Arid Zones of Rajasthan*(SCMBAZR) for 1999-2002 by the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India and as *Prosthecate Bacteria & Micrococcus Centre* (ProMiC) for 2000-2012 by the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India.

Algae Biofuel & Biomolecules Centre is the first and only **interdisciplinary research Centre** of the University being run under the aegis of the DoM since 3.3.2011. It has collaborations from the faculty members of the Departments of Environmental Science, Food Science & Nutrition, Economics and Management. It completed one MDS University coordinated research project in collaboration with Central University of Rajasthan (~Rs. 45 lakh) on developing algal cultivation systems and ran a project funded by the Parenteral Drug Association India Chapter (Rs. 50 lakh) for the development of moist wound care material.

The research focus of the Department of Microbiology on desert microorganisms earned the faculty inclusion in **Earth Microbiome Project** and subsequent authorship contribution for an article on microbial diversity in the world's most prestigious scientific journal “**Nature**”. The faculty collaborated in developing a mist-based cultivation system for algae with the University of Georgia Athens USA, for which it has been awarded a **US patent**. For algae cultivation, it has worked on plant hormone based medium to stimulate growth of algae and poultry litter extract and carpet industry wastewater as media as replacements of fertilizers.

The faculty successfully developed biopolymer based moist wound care material and presented a detailed protocol on evaluation of such material. For the first time it proposed and used an interactive biosorption process for anion (fluoride) removal. The DoM has also been the seat for deciphering- mechanisms of resistance of green algae to fluoride, quicker healing of wounds by ROS scavenging and triggering of desiccation tolerance by physical absence of water and not by osmotic water potential.

The Department has raised ~Rs. 81 lakh from Professional faculty fund fee, Rs. 54.9 lakh from SFS courses, Rs. 186.06 lakh for research projects as extramural funds (Total Rs. 320.96 lakh-largest sum contributed than any other department). It has the **unique distinction of leading a bi-institutional collaborative project, be a part of a multi-institutional collaborative research project and the only department that earned grants for research from industrial association.**

Programs of Learning and Pedagogy

The department offers Learner-centred education, had adopted choice-based credit system with multiple entry and exit for M.Sc. Microbiology since 2015 and for M.Sc. Biotechnology since 2020 with an intake of 20 seats each. A student may specialize in 9 different fields in M.Sc. Microbiology viz. Biochemistry and Physiology of Microorganisms, Microbiology of Extremes, Microorganisms Diversity and Ecology, Molecular Biology, Environmental Microbiology & Biotechnology, Industrial Microbiology & Biotechnology, Biofuel & Bioenergy, Medical Microbiology and Pharmaceutical Microbiology. Similarly, a M.Sc. Biotechnology student may specialize in Molecular Biology & Genetic Engineering, Plant Biotechnology, Animal Biotechnology, Medical Biotechnology, Industrial Biotechnology, Food Biotechnology, Pharmaceutical Biotechnology, Environmental Biotechnology and Entrepreneurship in Biotechnology.

The Department has a strength of 24 students in M.Sc. Microbiology, 10 in M.Sc. Biotechnology and 3 in PhD. Besides another 13 students from other departments chose courses in Microbiology department as interdisciplinary electives.

Microbiology was the first department to start using a training e-platform provided by Wooqer titled Microsphere in 2012 to deliver presentations (PPT and video) collect assignments, provide literature and extra teaching materials to the students. It was discontinued in 2019 due to the subscription charges. Later during covid19, the Department was first to begin online classes using Zoom, Microsoft Team, Google Meets and Canvas from 4.4.2020. Other than traditional teaching methods, it offers students various ways for overall learning such as multimedia presentations, Socratic Seminars, Tracking, site seeing, student seminars, 24x7 open laboratories for short-term and long-term project works, awareness campaigns, PG club, workshops and trainings.

The department offers Ph.D. since 1999 and allows interdisciplinary research.

Interdisciplinary Research:

Algae Biofuel & Biomolecules Centre (ABBC) was established in lines of Section 5 (d) of the University Act by the Board of Management of the Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University Ajmer vide Decision No. 12 dtd 28.8.2010 and Order No. F 13 () Acad-I/MDSU/2011/10532-70 dtd. 3.3.11. The ABBC is an interdisciplinary Research and Outreach Program involving 8 faculty members from Microbiology, Environmental Science, Food Science & Nutrition, Economics and Management.

Algae, a group of microscopic plants are known for Agar agar, Agarose, Kelp, Algin, Alginate, Carrageenan, Xanthophyll, Blue Green Algal Biofertilizers, production of fish-feed and food/feed supplements as Spirulina and Chlorella and Wastewater remediation, yet their potential for biofuel and bioenergy production is untapped. Rajasthan with ample of sunlight and long hours of sunshine is ideal for the cultivation of algae. Therefore, ABBC was established to conduct research and develop technologies for cheaper cultivation of algae as the feedstock for biofuel, bioenergy and biomolecules in a biorefinery mode and to generate workforce for >700 venture capital enterprises based on algae.

It has following functions:

- Research and technology development and demonstration
- Research collaborations
- Information dissemination
- Capability Building

Throughout the world there is an acute scarcity of persons trained in algae. The Centre proposes to begin a PG course in Biofuel & Bioenergy or in Microbiology with specialization on algae biofuel as soon as the faculty is inducted for Fermentation (Methane and Alcohols), Lignocellulose hydrolysis, Fuel Cell, Lipid transformation to biodiesel and biodiesel qualities, Biofuel crops and their cultivation.

Aims and goals

The ABBC aims to develop and disseminate economically feasible technology for biofuel production through algae and generate skilled manpower with a larger goal to wheel India's economic growth through carbon dioxide-neutral biofuels without using freshwater and arable land and simultaneously reducing its pollution load.

Objectives

To meet the above stated aims and goals, the following objectives are set:

1. Technology development for algae biodiesel production
2. Technology development for alternate algae biofuels production
3. Capability Building (HRD & Information dissemination)
4. Technology development to produce other biomolecules from the spent algal biomass
5. Technology demonstration and environmental impact assessment
6. Feasibility assessment
7. Technology dissemination, IPR & Human resource requirement assessment

Facilities developed:

1. Algae Cultivation Trial and Demonstration Area: 16 x 22 m fenced area with three trenches and small tray (1 x 1.5 ft) systems for solid surface and floating cultivations. Area is sufficiently big to put up Pilot Scale Mass cultivation Systems
2. Heavy duty Cooling Centrifuge
3. Oxitop BOD System with incubator
4. 62" x 28" x 14" fibersheet solid surface and raceway type cultivation system prototypes (3 each)

5. Titroline autotitration system
6. Automatic 6 place solvent extraction system

यशोमूर्ति सम्राट पृथ्वीराज अजयमेरु के शासक राजा सोमेश्वर एवं रानी कर्पूरी देवी की संतान थे। इनका मात्र ग्यारह वर्ष की अल्प आयु में राज्याभिषेक हुआ था। उनका तत्कालीन साम्राज्य हर्षवर्द्धन के राज्य से भी बड़ा था।

सम्राट पृथ्वीराज की कीर्ति दिग्दिगंत विस्तीर्ण थी। वे धनुर्विधा के विशाल अचूक तीरंदाज और शब्दभेदी बाण चलाने में पारंगत थे। राजा दशरथ के पश्चात् वे ही ऐसे राजपुरुष हुए, जिन्हें शब्दभेदी बाण में सिद्धहस्तता प्राप्त थी। संस्कृत, प्राकृत, अपभ्रंश, पेशची, मागधी व सूरसैनी के ज्ञाता व युद्धवीर कृतीवीर, धर्मवीर क्या-क्या नहीं थे।

अजयमेरु से दिल्ली तक के वृहत साम्राज्य को संचालित करने वाले सम्राट पृथ्वीराज चौहान ने अपने जीवन काल में विदेशी विधर्मी आक्रामकों की हिन्दुस्तान विजय की कुटिल कामना पूरी नहीं होने दी। पृथ्वीराज एक युग के उस संकल्प के प्रतीक बने, जिसमें विधर्मी आक्रामकों के स्वप्नों को चूर करने की जलभावनाओं को प्रकट किया, पर विचार रखें। इस अवसर पर समिति के पदाधिकारी, सदस्य एवं शहर के प्रबुद्ध गणमान्य लोग उपस्थित रहे।

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ALL INDIA SURVEY ON HIGHER EDUCATION CELL

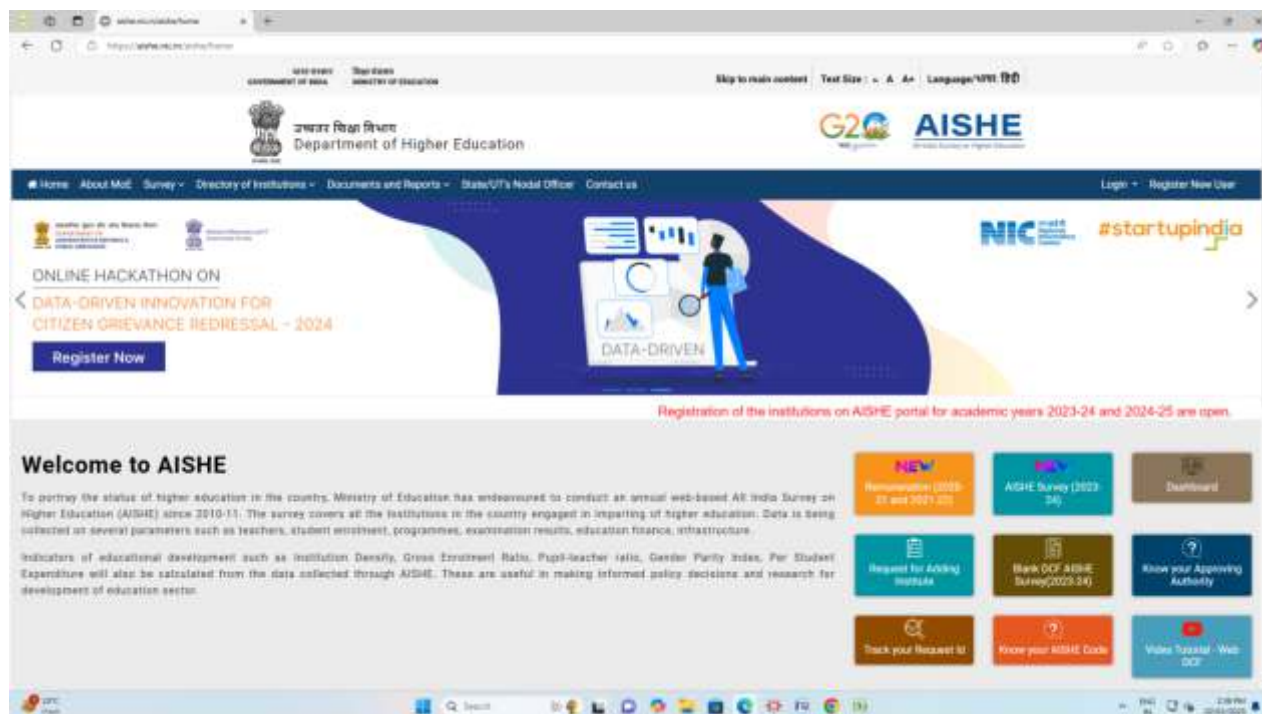
To portray the status of higher education in the country, Ministry of Education has endeavored to conduct an annual web-based All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) since 2010-11. The survey covers all the Institutions in the country engaged in imparting higher education. Data is being collected on several parameters such as teachers, students' enrolment, programmes, examination results, education finance, infrastructure, etc. Indicators of educational development such as Institution Density, Gross Enrolment Ratio, Pupil-teacher ratio, Gender Parity Index, Per Student Expenditure also be calculated from the data collected through AISHE. These are useful in making informed policy decisions and research for development of education sector.

The uploading of the information is mandatory by **Gazette of India Notification** 22 June 2015, GSR 517(E): **University Grants Commission Returns of Information by Universities (Rules 2004)**; also pre-requisite for release of the scholarship, grants, etc.

The University is uploading the campus statistics since 2010-11 and established this Cell on 19/12/2014 in compliance of the Ministry's order, to coordinate the compilation of statistics of all the Affiliated Colleges as well as of the university campus comprising of the following:

GARGI GIRLS HOSTEL

The Gargi Girls' Hostel is located in the University campus. With 16 rooms of double occupancy and 48 rooms of single occupancy, it can house a total of 80 students in a safe and congenial environment. The hostel has an in-house mess which is run on a contract basis. Students are offered breakfast, lunch and dinner along with morning and evening tea. Administration of the hostel includes a full-time warden, an in-house matron, office staff and a lady peon. The Hostel Advisory Committee is constituted for matters related to admission and any other policy matters. The fee is charged on an yearly basis and includes room rent (separate for single or double rooms), water, electricity, establishment charges, caution money, mess charge, hostel security deposit, common room fees, utensils, miscellaneous and improvement charges. The students admitted in the teaching departments of the university are eligible for admission in the hostel. New admissions and renewal of admissions are made twice on the basis of two terms, each term being of 6 months.

Facilities in the hostel:

Mess, Common Room, Visitors' Room, Television Room, WiFi, Common Induction Plate facility, Badminton Court among others.

NACHIKETA BOYS HOSTEL

Nachiketa Boys Hostel has the capacity of accommodating about 40 boys. The rooms in the hostel are single bedded rooms. Mess of the Hostel was maintained by the students on the Cooperative basis.

The amenities and facilities available to the residents of the Hostel are as follows:

2024-2025 NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

Popularly known as NSS, the scheme was launched in Gandhiji's Centenary year, 1969, aimed at developing student's personality through community service. NSS, is a voluntary association of young people in Colleges, Universities and at +2 level working for a campus-community linkage.

The cardinal principle of the NSS programme is that it is organised by the students themselves, and both students and teachers through their combined participation in community service, get a sense of involvement in the tasks of nation building.

The National Service Scheme at MaharshiDayanandSaraswatiUniversity provides each student with a significant context in which he/she can arrive at a deeper understanding of social reality in India today. The NSS encourages the meaning of the life through service. By the spirit of seva, the NSS volunteers try to attain to the real knowledge of the person and the environment and to a set of values integral to the Indian way of life.

The motto of the National Service Scheme (N.S.S.) is **"Not Me, But You"**. This expresses the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for selfless services and appreciation of another man's point of view and also show consideration for fellow human beings. It underlines the welfare of an individual is ultimately dependent on the welfare of society as a whole; therefore it should be the aim of the N.S.S. to demonstrate this motto in its day-to-day activities.

This programme is to inculcate the social welfare thoughts in the students, and to provide service to the society without any prejudice. NSS volunteers work hard to ensure that every one in our society who is needy gets the every possible help from them so that they can also enhance their standards and lead a life of dignity in the society with all of us. In doing so, the volunteers themselves learn a lot from the people in villages like how to struggle and how to lead a happy life in the extreme scarcity of resources and personality development through social service.

Objectives behind NSS:

- To enable the students to understand the community in which they work.
- To understand themselves in relation to their community.
- To identify the needs and problems in the community in the solution of which they can be involved.
- To develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility.
- To apply their education in finding practical solution to individual and community problems.

- To develop competence required for group living and sharing responsibilities.
- Gain skills in mobilising community participation.
- To acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude.
- To develop capacity to meet emergencies and national disasters
- To practice national integration.

National Service Scheme has been running in the University since 1999. In starting phase one unit of NSS was started but now three units are being conducted. There are 300 seats available in three units against which 300 students have registered themselves in 2024-2025 session.
