1. There shall be 9 papers (4 papers in Previous examination and 5 papers in Final examination). Each theory paper shall be of three hours duration having 100 marks each. Dissertation/thesis/survey work/field work prescribed, if any, in lieu of a theory paper shall be of 100 marks (50 marks for Dissertation/thesis/survey work/field work prescribed, if any and 50 marks for Viva-voce).
2. The maximum marks for each paper/practical shall be shown in the syllabus for the subject concerned. It will be necessary for a candidate to pass in the theory part as well as in the practical part (wherever prescribed) of a subject/Paper separately.
3. A candidate for a pass at each of the Previous and the Final Examination shall be required to obtain (i) atleast 36% marks in the aggregate of all the paper prescribed for the examination and (ii) at least 36% marks in practical (s) wherever prescribed at the examination, provided that if a candidate fails to secure atleast 25% marks in each individual paper work. Wherever prescribed, he shall be deemed to have failed at the examination notwithstanding his having obtained the minimum percentage of marks required in the aggregate for that examination. No division will be awarded at the Previous Examination, Division shall be awarded at the end of the Final Examination combined marks obtained at the Previous and the Final Examination taken together, as noted below.

 All the rest will be declared to have passed the examination.
4. If a candidate clears any paper(s) Practical (s)/Dissertation prescribed at the Previous and/or Final Examination after a continuous period of three years, then for the purpose of working out his division the minimum pass marks only viz. 25% (36% in the case of practical) shall be taken into account in respect of such paper (s) Practical (s) Dissertation are cleared after the expiry of the aforesaid period of three years, provided that in case where a candidate requires more than 25% marks in order to reach the minimum aggregate as many marks out of those actually secured by him will be taken into account as would enable him to make the deficiency in the requisite minimum aggregate.
5. Only such candidates shall be permitted to offer Dissertation/Thesis/Field work/Survey Report (if provided in the syllabi concerned) in lieu of a paper who have secured atleast 55% marks in the aggregate of all the papers prescribed for the previous examination irrespective of the number of papers in which a candidate actually appeared at the examination.

6. The Thesis/Dissertation/Survey Report/ Field work shall be type-written and submitted in triplicate to the principal of the college concerned or the head of the dept. concerned, as the case may be atleast 7 days before the commencement of the theory examinations. The principal/head of the dept. concerned must ensure that the dissertation / Thesis / Survey Report so submitted reach to the office of the registrar, with in a week's time. Evaluation of the dissertation and field work shall be conducted centralised.

**PRACTICAL**

**Paper A- Landscape Painting**

100 Marks

Time: 10 Hours, Two sessions of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  hours in two consecutive days. Two sittings every day with a break of one hour in between. Landscape painting on the spot in oil or in water colour with proper handling of medium and perspective. Landscape of Lanes, Cityscapes, Skyscapes and Hillscapes should be painted. Study of bridges, lakes and group of trees with special effects of environment and also effects of light and shadow. Examiner should reach at the centre atleast one hour before the beginning of the examination. Examination should be conducted on the spot.

Size of the Paper:  $\frac{1}{2}$  Imperial

Medium: Oil colour, Acrylic colour or water colour

**Paper B- Portrait Painting**

100 Marks

Time: 10 Hours, Two sessions of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  hours in two consecutive days. Two sittings every day with a break of one hour in between.

The Examiner will send an instructions paper to the Principal to be opened 24 hours before the fixed date for examination, in which he or she will clearly explain about the model, background etc. The Principal before the Head of the Department of Drawing and Painting will open the instructions paper and hand over him so that he or she can make arrangements for the same. Examiner should reach at the centre before the beginning of the examination.

Size of the Paper:  $\frac{1}{2}$  Imperial

Medium: Oil colour, Acrylic or water colour

**Paper C- Print Making (Lino or Wood)**

100 Marks

Time: 10 Hours, Two sessions of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  hours in two consecutive days. Two sittings every day with a break of one hour in between.

Examiner should reach at the centre before the beginning of the examination. External Examiner and Internal Examiner will prepare the question

paper in which they put atleast five topics from daily life. Candidate will choose one topic from them and prepare a layout in Black and White colour on given drawing sheet and submit to the examiner after the first sitting. In the end, the candidate will submit their preliminary sketches and block with the final print. Size: Size of the graphic should not exceed  $10'' \times 8'' / 25 \times 20$  cm.

**SUBMISSION OF WORK:**

50 Marks

Every candidate will have to submit the following work mounted and in a proper portfolio one month before the commencement of the Annual Examination duly signed by the subject teacher:

- i) Ten plates of each practical paper offered, executed in any medium  
Size: near about  $\frac{1}{2}$  Imp. or larger.
- ii) In paper B, the candidate will submit ten portraits- One cast study in pencil, One in monochrome and Eight in colours studied from living models.
- iii) A sketch-book containing not less than 250 (sketches) papers. Sketches should be of human figures, animals, study of trees, lanes, huts, rocks, hills and bridges, group of objects, monuments, buildings. Creative sketches can also be submitted.  
Size of the paper-  $\frac{1}{2}$  Imperial  
Medium – Pen, Pencil, Ink or colour.
- iv) Marks on the submission work will be awarded internally by the Head of the Department of Drawing and Painting with the consent of subject teacher jointly. The work of the candidate will be retained for one month after the declaration of the result. The department will not be responsible for the submission work.
- v) All the plates should be mounted well and be presented in proper portfolio.  
Note: Department will take every care of the submission work but it will not be responsible for any damage or loss. The candidate will have no right to claim against the loss.

- (e) Examination answer sheets (Paintings) will be retained in the department and will be preserved atleast for twelve months after the declaration of result. These should not be returned to the candidates.
- (f) The department should also arrange for an educational tour to ancient and modern art centres like Ajanta, Ellora, Elephanta, Khajuraho, Mahabalipuram, National Exhibitions Modern Art Galleries, Art Colleges and places suitable for outdoor sketching.

Duration: 15 Hours in 6 sittings of 2½ hours each of 3 consecutive days. Two sitting every day with a break of 1 hour in between.

Size: Imperial (Paper or Canvas)

Medium: Oil colour, Acrylic or water colour

Note: The External Examiner will send practical Question paper alongwith direction before commencement of practical examination. The Internal Examiner and the External Examiner will evaluate the answer sheets (Practical work-Painting) on the last day after the last sitting of practical examination.

**Paper E: Graphics (Etching or Litho or Serigraph)** 100 Marks

Duration: 15 Hours in 6 sittings of 2½ hours each of 3 consecutive days. Two sitting every day with a break of 1 hour in between.

Size of the Graphic should not exceed 10"×8"/25×20 cms.

Candidate will submit their preliminary Sketches and block alongwith the final prints.

**Paper F: Composition** 100 Marks

Duration: 15 Hours in 6 sittings of 2½ hours each of 3 consecutive days. Two sitting every day with a break of 1 hour in between.

Size: Imperial (Paper or Canvas) 24"×30"

Medium: Oil colour, Acrylic or water colour

The candidate will prepare a composition on a given subject. Preliminary sketch (Layout) of the final composition will be done in colours and in ¼ Imp. size. The layout at least be submitted after the first sitting which will be attached to the final composition. Treatment may be traditional, realistic or modern. Atleast three figures should be arranged.

Note: The External Examiner will send practical Question paper alongwith direction before commencement of practical examination. The Internal Examiner and the External Examiner will evaluate the answer sheets (Practical work-Painting) on the last day after the last sitting of practical examination.

### SUBMISSION OF WORK:

- (f) An educational tour arranged by the department to an ancient and modern art centres like Ajanta, Ellora, Elephanta, Khajuraho, Mahabalipuram, National Exhibitions Modern Art Galleries, Art Colleges and places suitable for outdoor sketching will be compulsory for every candidate.
